



The Gosden Lighthouse is a building in the school where many exciting, creative activities and projects take place. It is available for students from reception to 16 as part of the regular curriculum, or as a hub for focus days and weeks. It is also used for past 16 Arts Summer Schools.

Downstairs

There is an Art and Craft room where all sorts of creative projects from willow weaving to print making, clay work and sculpture take place.



Along the corridor are two animation rooms where pupils create their own animations and then show them.



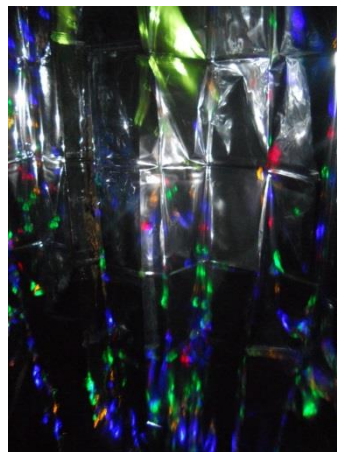
Further on is the music room where choir sessions for all ages take place.

Upstairs

There is a flexible space which can be used for art exhibitions, drama or group work with visiting artists.



There is a small flat which is used to teach life skills such as cooking, washing, hygiene, entertaining and applied Maths and English



A new textiles room has been created, equipped with sewing machines and special fabric printers. There is also an immersive room where pupils can experience interactive art and experiment with sight and sound.

The use of the lighthouse evolves with time, according to the needs of the school and individuals. This is especially evident during our focus weeks.
