

Our Anti- Bullying Charter

During Anti- Bullying week 2011, KS4 Lunchtime Club did some work talking about bullying and how harmful it is. We went on to focus on positive ways we can all, (child, teacher, parent, carer etc) prevent and tackle bullying. In the same week, students from all Key Stages and an adult or two, made hand-prints.

Blue is the symbolic anti-bullying colour. Our handprints are unique to each of us and we must celebrate our “uniqueness”. They are different sizes and shades of colour – just like us.

They form a heart, symbolic of love and care. “This is our school....” Is the start of our school prayer.....”as many hands build a house, so many hearts make a school.”

...And the orange foot-print? You can decide what this means for you.... Perhaps it’s the child with a disability, whose sexuality is “different” or whose behaviour or emotional difficulties mean they need a little extra understanding. We still believe they have a right to keep safe, feel proud and deserve respect in school and outside in the world beyond our gates.
