SQUIRREL CLASS



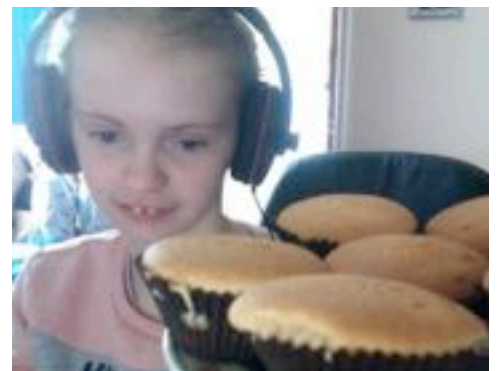
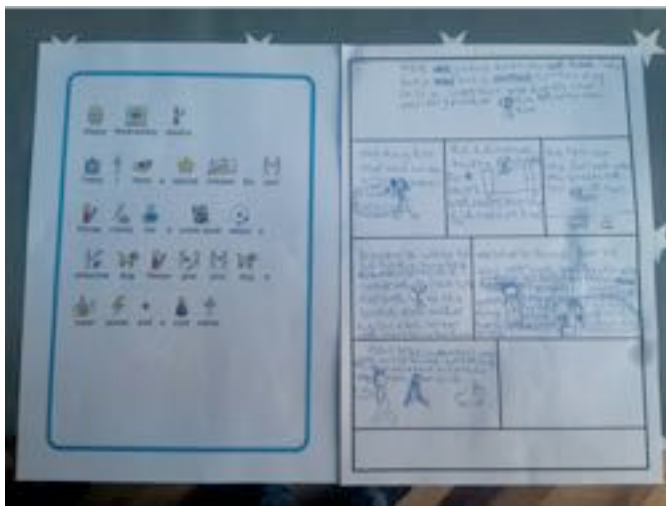

OUR LOVELY ANIMALS – SANDRA TIDBURY

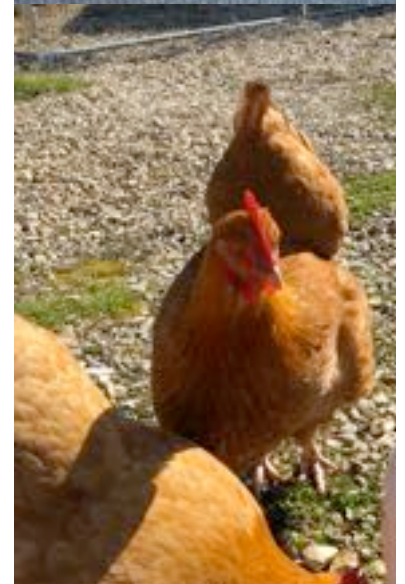
