
Message from Cindy,

This week Foxes have been completing some great challenges at home during lockdown, including making nature art like this leaf caterpillar and seeing who can build the tallest tower out of different objects!






SECONDARY MINI NEW

HAVING FUN IN THE SUN


Hello everybody!
