As you will see from this week's news, we spent Focus Week looking at Black Lives Matter and why it is important to understand the concepts of equity and unconscious bias. Big themes for some of us, but we believe it is important for 2 reasons: Firstly, because our young people need advocates to make sure that they can have the right support and opportunities to reach their potential and their goals; secondly because our young people need to Speak Up! We need to hear everyone's voice in Surrey, and at Gosden we believe all young people need to be heard and listened to. This is part of our British Values curriculum, but it leads nicely into Anti-Bullying Week. We are encouraging our pupils to recognise when somebody needs a hand, or when they need help themselves, and to speak up! This we can stay safer, develop self-confidence and make a positive contribution to society.

Some of our pupils have been sharing their views on safety and safeguarding issues, which are being shared with the Surrey Safeguarding Children Partnership. This is a group of system leaders from Health, the Local Authority, Police and Education. They will be listening and responding to our pupils, in order to make Surrey and safer place for all children and young people. As ever, I am so proud that our pupils are so confident and articulate in sharing their views with adults in influential roles.

Speaking of speaking up, the PTA have an AGM coming up and will be seeking nominees for key roles. Our PTA are the beating heart of the Gosden community, so please do get involved, get active and join in. Not only will you be supporting the children and the school, but you will also be supporting other parents and carers. I cannot speak highly enough of the dedicated band who have been running the PTA, and I hope that they will remain centrally involved (whether or not in specific roles). We are lucky to have such a passionate PTA and community.

And for those of you who might be wondering, Christmas at Gosden promises to be as magical and emotional as it always is. Please remember though to get your letters sent off to the North Pole early, Royal Mail and reindeer mail will be needing a good run at Christmas this year!

"We understand that black lives matter does not mean that other lives do not matter!"







Year 11 Secret Garden Sanctuary Trip

So....our adventures at the Secret Garden Sanctuary included:

- An ENORMOUS pig called Grace
- A GIANT pumpkin which even Nina couldn't lift
- A CUTE blind rabbit called Norbert
- A NASTY ferret bite for Sandra, and
- HEAVY WET RAIN

We arrived and met Hayley, who is a vulnerable adult, and who set up the farm for vulnerable adults and young people. It is a charity that receives no money unless there is significant fundraising and at this time there is none happening.

The Year 11 girls were amazing, the only people moaning about the rain were the adults! They were really interested in Hayley when she talked about the farm and its animals and were really keen to help raise money for the animals.

There are about 180 mouths to feed, all rescued birds and animals and if no money comes in they won't be able to feed them and some may have to be put down. There are many projects that need to be undertaken, an allotment, more animal grazing areas, a sensory garden and a wildlife and pond area. One of the girls suggested a trip with Frankie and the Animal Care Group to do some volunteering.

Charlotte is keen to do some weekend volunteering, so watch this space!

The trip was great and a real eye-opener and we all had loads of respect for Hayley and the volunteers who work there, trying to make a difference. One of Hayley's volunteers went to Gosden 34 years ago and is now 38, so remembers all the "old" staff (Miss Dockerill!!!).

Fish and chips back at Gosden and chocolate brownies and ice cream finished the day off nicely!!!










PTA NEWS
