

You don't need me to give you another safety message, I will instead wish all our families and safe and happy Christmas, whether you are with your loved ones in a house or over Zoom.










KS4 Food Studies









SAPPHIRE BUBBLE DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY



Sapphire Bubble have been busy in DT classes this term. They have made:

Wind Chimes

Hawking Class have designed and made some fabulous wind chimes this term.

They decided upon an image, researched it and used their research to help them develop a great idea. They experimented with the lengths of the chimes and measured and cut them out of aluminium tube. They smoothed and drilled the ends. Next they cut out the shape for the top of the chimes using tin snips and abrasaws. They filed and smoothed the edges and used centre punches and bossing mallets to shape and add detail to the metal. They used metal markers to decorate the top and joined it all together with fishing wire. They then tested and evaluated their finished chimes.





Clocks

Parks class designed and made a novelty clock to suit a particular person and go in a chosen place. They researched suitable themes for their target audience, produced several ideas and developed the best one. Then they investigated the properties of a wide variety of materials before choosing the best one. They used a wide variety of tools and machines to make and finish their clocks. They drilled holes and added a clock mechanism, hands and numerals. Lastly they evaluated their clocks to see how much they suited their target audience.

Christmas Tree Festival

Sapphire bubble designed, made and decorated a 6ft high Christmas tree to be part of Shalford Church's Christmas tree Festival.

As a group they decided to make it out of found or recycled materials. They collected branches, leaves and fir cones, painted and added glitter to them. They were then strung together in a Christmas tree shape. Each student made and painted a heart shaped picture frame and carefully drew and decorated the picture inserts. They also made tiny wreaths made from willow and decorated them with bows and baubles.

The tree was then installed in Shalford church along with 40 other trees from various local organisations. It will be on display from 10 am – 4pm from now until Christmas day. Do please pop in and look if you are passing.

During last half term, 6 students from Year 10 have donned their face masks and "space suits" or special disposable overalls to work in a cold old workshop to work on engines!

They have been going to GASP Motor Project to learn how to take off wheels on quad bikes and mini moto's, how to use a ratchet and spanner, how to fix a lawn mower, how to be safe around engines and generally have an amazing time using lots of different tools.

The course has enabled independence, confidence building, problem solving and the development of new skills in a working environment. It is a nurturing environment where each student can excel and Gosden House School is very lucky to have this link with GASP. One of the young people in Year 10 is going to attend 1-1 sessions in February next year to begin to develop further, his already expanding knowledge - as he is very keen to become a mechanic in the future. 

The <u>Crisis Helpline</u> is staffed by professionals who are experienced in working with people with mental health issues and is managed according to the NHS Code of Confidentiality which respects individuals' personal information. However, the service has a duty to respond when someone's thoughts, intentions and actions indicate a specific and significant risk of harm to self or others particularly children). Such cases will be followed up and the relevant service or authorities will be contacted.

In an emergency please call 999 or go to Accident and Emergency (A&E) – many of which have psychiatric liaison services. You can find local A&E services at NHS Choices.

Out of hours crisis support for children with a mental health need.

Out of hours crisis support for children, young people and their families has been increased in response to Coronavirus.

Children, aged 11 and over, and their families can continue to call our Extended Hope Service for crisis support between 5pm-11pm, 7 days a week. Calls to this service are handled by the Emergency Duty Team and we have now put in place a triage worker to provide an immediate response to anyone calling this number: 01483 517898.

In addition, our Mental Health Crisis Helpline is now providing telephone support to children, young people and their families between 11pm and 9am, seven days a week, to ensure they always have access to out of hours crisis support. During normal working hours people can talk to their GP or go to A&E for support and children, aged 10-18, can contact one of the CYP Havens.



A Safe Place to get support when I am feeling distressed and worried about how I am feeling'

Due to public health advice the CYP Havens are currently closed. Instead we are running a virtual service for young people to access support by phone. This service is available every day of the week including bank holidays
