

What it is good for: accurate counting, numeral writing, problem solving and number sums.

## 'Home' Number Hunt!



What you need: paper and pen to make simple chart (shown opposite) or 'house number hunt sheet' printed (document on class page)

## What to do:

1. Look at 'house number hunt sheet'. Make sure you understand what each of the objects are and what you are looking for around your house.
2. Using a clip board or book to lean on, start at the top; look for 'windows'. Go round your house finding and counting each object at a time. Record the number you find. Keep going until you have recorded the correct number of all objects.
3. Look at your results. What are there most of? What are there fewest of?
4. Answer some more questions on your results:

- How many doors and windows are there altogether? Show your working out.
- How many more windows are there than doors? Show your working out. How many more doors are there than tables? Show your working out.

Extension: Can you double any of the numbers? Which combination of objects makes the largest/ smallest total? Show your sums.
