Strategic Objective: EDI: Review policies and practice to ensure Gosden is reflecting the profile of the children, families and community, taking into account equity, diversity and inclusion.

Vision: Gosden House will recognise the unique aspects of the school community and ensure visibility for all, recognising and celebrating diversity, and providing equity of offer and opportunities for those with protected characteristics. External partnership and community links will be strengthened, keeping EDI in mind.

Strategic Objective: Gosden is a Learning School: Build on and review pedagogical practice and curriculum to ensure exceptional quality of education.

Vision: Building Learning Power is fundamental to professional practice. The curriculum is referenced back to the National Curriculum, with a firm justification for how Gosden modifies our offer to ensure a cohesive, appropriate learning journey for every learner. Key learning areas will be developed: Learning Outdoors, Literacy; and other core subjects will be further improved: RSHE, Maths.

Strategic Objective: Pastoral: Continue to improve pastoral support to children and families, ensuring Mental Health is a key focus.

Vision: Within the context of worsening economic circumstances and subsequent impact on vulnerable children and families, Gosden will provide Early Help, within budget constraints and capacity of team. This will include signposting and supporting families to access services externally where available. All staff will be confident in promoting good mental health and responding to need where identified.
