The second half term for Badger Class has been just as busy as the first one!

We have been finding out about the Polar Regions. We have used the **Listening**, **Noticing** and **Explaining** Learning Habits to find information from non-fiction clips and texts about the Arctic and Antarctic and the animals that live there. We have learnt new vocabulary and facts about the icy environment, polar bears and penguins and have created questions and sentences using widgets. In order to practise them we have been saying them and we are working really hard on our pencil control so we can write them too. Did you know that polar bears are the biggest bears on Earth and penguins are birds



We use our **Keep Trying** Learning Habit every morning as we work really hard on our phonics. We are learning the sounds and cued articulation signs for the sounds, making words with magnetic letters and blending the sounds to make words. The children have also been working on letter formation.

In Maths, we like **Learning Together**, playing Maths games as we practise recognising, ordering and writing the numerals. We have been finding out that numbers are made up of smaller numbers in our Outdoor Learning and have even been working on the part, part, whole model.

Badger Class love swimming, we have been brave and we are doing so well!

We are enjoying making some Christmas decorations, just remember to come and watch us dance in the Christmas Production!

This term we have been looking at light in science. We explored how water changes the way that we see things by experimenting with items in water. We then looked at paintings inspired by water and tried to do our own works of art!






In life skills we have been learning about first aid. We discussed what to do in case of an emergency. We then practiced putting on plasters and dressing more serious wounds. A first aider then came into school and gave us a practical session on how to put someone into the recovery position and how to do CPR. We felt good that we can now help someone in need.



Some of us have been savouring the sights and smells of autumn. In literacy, we went on an autumn walk and collected leaves and berries. We then thought of words to describe what we had found, before writing some fantastic autumn poems.

Some of the Year 11 cohort have been working with Paul Sharpe, who is the Youth Development Manager for The Matrix Trust. They have been participating in a six week 'Job Searchers Toolkit' workshop. Each week, Paul joins us at school and shares with the group crucial skills needed in the world of work. These sessions cover areas such as: job applications, finding vacant positions, CVs, covering letters, goal setting, interview preparation, life values and future possibilities.





With work experience starting shortly after Christmas, Year 11 are being introduced to their employers. This week, we had a visit from Surrey Police Workshop, based in Bramley and Bushy Business based in Cranleigh. These employers will be supporting our work experience by having three of our learners for a two week placement. In order to help to prepare our learners for the work ahead, they kindly made the trip into school to introduce themselves, meet the learners and share what they will be getting up to.



Next week, is our last session with Paul, where he will be conducting mock interviews based on a specific job vacancy. Each learner will be given a fifteen minute slot to perform under interview conditions.

Last week, we had the pleasure of welcoming 'Daisy First Aid' to Gosden. Feola, the first aid trainer, showed us how to deal with somebody who was unconscious, CPR, bandages, choking, calling the emergency services and how to use a defibrillator. We all used our 'Being Brave' Learning Muscles to take turns at having a go ourselves!







# FORGING FUTURES

Over the last few weeks, our social enterprise project with Forging Futures has continued. The group have been visiting The Forge on the Green each week and have been learning lots about the catering and hospitality industry. This time, the group have called themselves the 'Gosden Great Bakers' and their chosen positive impact project is to raise funds to allow us to hire a photo booth at prom!

# Add Everyone' Group Chats Safeguarding Alert



Recent concerns have emerged regarding a WhatsApp group known as 'Add Everyone.' Schools and regional police forces across the UK have warned that this group exposes children and young people to explicit and harmful material.

'Add everyone' group chats (also known by other names) are spaces where children and young people are invited, and encouraged to invite others into a group chat. These chats may contain inappropriate content, sexual images, self-harm, sexual violence or racism. Some chats also encourage the sharing of personal details. It can be difficult to control who becomes a member in such chats meaning that children and young people can become vulnerable.

These chats can seem appealing for many children and young people who seek social connection and are not aware of the potential dangers. Chat creaters, often strangers, exploit curiosity and share harmful content.


