

At the end of our last half term, Robins and Owls worked together to bake some gingerbread men. After following the clues around the school and 'Asking Questions' to witnesses, we found a letter from Gingie – he explained that it was too hot in the oven, and he wasn't ready to be eaten yet, so he decided to get out and explore the world.







This half term, as part of our Around the World topic, we have been receiving post cards from Gingie with some information on all of the places he has visited. In class, we have been using our '**Exploring**' learning habit to discover as much as we can about the different countries, cultures and climates. So far, we have explored the castles and beaches of Wales, tried some tasty Bolos de Arroz and Pastel de nata from Portugal, and moved to music from Pakistan.

Last week, Gingie went to the Amazon rainforest, and sent us a parcel filled with all different resources to help us to gain a deeper understanding. We explored the contents in a Sensology session, where we tasted dark chocolate and drank orange juice, felt heat and rain at the same time, 'listened' to the sounds of the rainforest, smelled coffee beans and looked to spot Gingie in his photographs! This week, we are busy celebrating the Lunar New Year and learning about different aspects of China. We cannot wait to see where Gingie heads next!



In Foxes we have taken every opportunity to use our 'problem solving' and 'exploring' learning habits to start the new year and new term creatively. From using dressing up and role play to innovate our class story in our drama lessons to creating our own science experiments in our class 'lab' after noticing changes in the school allotments over winter.





In Maths, Foxes have been using their 'explaining' learning habits to explain or demonstrate their answers to 'how' and 'why' questions. They set up their own problems for others to solve about comparing the length and mass of objects.

The children are allowed to come to school on that day wearing something red and or with fun headwear or hair. Please bring in a suggested donation of £1 for Comic Relief.


There will also be an art competition which will be completed in school.

We have had a busy half term so far and have been enjoying our learning about Victorian Life. We have looked at landscapes and have compared what life was like before and after the Industrial Revolution and how it changed the country. This included looking at Lowry's paintings of industrial areas within Britain and how factories appeared in a lot of his work. We took this opportunity to sketch and charcoal images inspired by his collection.



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In Citizenship we have been learning about human rights and our rights as a member of society. As a result, we created a tapestry of a specific human right we wanted to represent and have displayed it outside our classroom. To understand what life was like then, we explored how children lived in the Victorian era. This included researching and recording information about jobs children may have had to undertake. We were shocked to learn that some children were only 4 years old when they had to go up narrow chimneys to clean them. Some of us looked around our school to see how small the fireplaces were and tried to imagine what it may have been like climbing inside it. We were pleased that we have a right to education and can attend school, unlike some of the children long ago.


