Thanks to Jo, Harmony, the School Council and Kestrels class, we now have a clothing, shoes and textiles recycling bin at Gosden! As well as a way of recycling these items, it will also earn the school 20p for every Kilo collected, so the more we can collect, the more we earn!

Please feel free to use the bin at drop off or pick up, or send in a collection with the taxi/minibus in the morning. If sending in with transport, please ensure the bag is clearly labelled "FOR RECYCLING BIN" as we are unable to gain access once the bag has been deposited.





The items that can be collected and recycled are: clothes, shoes, bed linen, accessories such as belts, hats, gloves, scarves and handbags.
Duvets, off cuts and carpets/curtains are NOT able to be recycled.





With the money raised from the Shalford Christmas coffee morning, our Site Team have been busy replacing the old tool shed in the allotment area, with a brand new one. We have now also got a specific potting area. Everyone in the gardening team is delighted.

This half term in Robin Class, our learning has centred around our topic, 'On the Farm'. We have enjoyed learning about the different roles that people and animals have on a farm, like sheep, who provide us with wool, and vets, who take care of all of the animals. We have also been drawing comparisons between cities and the countryside, identifying similarities and differences between the environments.

In our Maths learning, we began by exploring cardinality, and the different ways that we could represent an amount. We noticed that we could use numerals, Unifix cubes, Numicon and a range of counting objects in a tens frame to represent our amounts, and enjoyed finding new ways to show different amounts.

















In our Literacy lessons, we have been immersed in our class text – 'What the Ladybird Heard' by Julia Donaldson. We have labelled the characters with a range of adjectives, generated predictions of what we think might happen in the story and created our own maps. Now that we've finished our book, we've even turned into News Reporters to have a go at retelling the story!

Fox class have been delighted to welcome three new class mates this half term. Our 'learning together' learning habit has been put to good use as we support our new class mates and introduce them to all the wonderful learning activities on offer at Gosden from creating our own characters in drama to our outdoor adventures involving cooking and goats!









In RE, we have been looking at Bible stories and the theme of kindness. We have been exploring the idea of being 'saved' and the term 'saviour'. Fox class have used their 'creative' and' learning together' learning habits to act out different scenes from Bible stories which demonstrate people being kind and helpful. We then used our 'creative' learning habit to create scenarios where we can be kind and helpful to our friends at school.











The School Council have been very busy this term spending some of their fundraising efforts. They provided new pens for each class and a smart new rainbow friendship bench for the playground.



They are planning an Easter raffle to support Canine Concern who offer support dogs for visits to schools. We are very lucky to have Kiwi coming in to school once a week to spend time with our pupils. Tickets will cost £1 each and you can buy up to 5 tickets with a chance to win a chocolate hamper or one of 3 runners up eggs.





The School Council organised our Red Nose Day event and will look forward to counting the donations and letting you know how much we raised. They are also looking forward to judging the Red Nose decorating activity and seeing just how creative everyone has been. #### THE ARTS SOCIETY

Pick's ambition was to make Art part of every journey. 100 years later the Underground still commissions Art and Design for each of its stations, pushing the boundaries of public Art.

In our own way we have embraced the spirit of this vision and have collaborated with South Western Railways to exhibit local young artists' work within the Waiting Rooms, Ticket Halls and Platforms of their stations.

Art @ the Station was conceived by The Arts Society and has developed to comprise a rolling series of Art from young artists in the public space of a station's Waiting Room, Ticket Hall or Platform, giving the students a rare chance to have their work displayed within a 'real exhibition', publicly.

The work is sourced from local schools, colleges and community projects and typically is changed on a termly basis.

Year 10 and 11 Arts Award DT students had the opportunity to visit an art exhibition called Evoking Connections in Epsom. The exhibition was all about bringing neurotypical and neurodivergent artists together and was curated by Marcele Silvina, a neurodivergent artist who the students had the opportunity to meet on the day.
